

## GUIDELINES Organization of the Year

## <u>CRITERIA</u> | Applications will be judged on the following criteria:

- ✓ <u>Achievement</u>: The nomination must reflect the actual accomplishment(s) achieved through voluntary service **during the 2018 calendar year** (*information pertaining to prior years outside the past calendar year of 2018 will not be considered by judges*).
- ✓ <u>Community Needs</u>: The volunteer community service must address unmet human, educational, health, environmental, quality of life or public safety needs.
- ✓ <u>Ongoing Involvement</u>: The voluntary community service must be hands-on and ongoing rather than a one-time activity, with the exception of outstanding service for short-term crisis situations, or special projects providing ongoing service that may extend beyond the one-year period.
- ✓ Nominations should <u>respond to each of the five areas listed below</u> to describe the achievement, contribution and impact made to the community by the nominated organization.
- ✓ A winning organization cannot be nominated the following year.
- ✓ Nominated organizations do not have to be based in Dublin, but must provide services which have substantially benefitted the residents of Dublin.

## NOMINATION PROCEDURE | The following documentation should be submitted:

- Official nomination form or online form at <a href="http://www.dublin.ca.gov/vre/nomination">http://www.dublin.ca.gov/vre/nomination</a>.
- A 500-word (maximum) summary that describes the nominee's accomplishments based on the five established criteria listed below. *Please note: Accomplishments pertaining to years prior to 2018 will not be considered by the judges.*
- One current photograph of the members of the nominated organization for use at the Volunteer Recognition Event. Digital photographs can be emailed to <a href="mailto:Darla.murtaugh@dublin.ca.gov">Darla.murtaugh@dublin.ca.gov</a>.

To ensure impartial selection of winner, judging is completed by volunteer judges not affiliated with the City of Dublin.

Judges will score each nominee using the following rating system: Fair Good Excellent

(1-3) (4-7) (8-10)

Nominees will be evaluated on the following five areas:

- 1. Time and effort spent project(s)/activity in 2018.
- 2. Overall relevance and importance of project(s)/activity to the community in 2018.
- 3. Originality and uniqueness of effort(s) in 2018.
- 4. Overcoming a challenge in accomplishing the project(s)/activity in 2018.
- 5. Resource utilization, i.e. volunteers, funds, public interest, etc.
