Enter Your Small Business Story to Win \$25,000 from Wells Fargo



On May 29, the East Bay Economic Development Alliance (East Bay EDA) released the 2014-2015 East Bay Economic Development Outlook Report, which states that economic recovery in the region is putting people back to work and improving the economic climate and the quality of life for many East Bay residents. DSRSD Board To Implement Water Rate Increases



In response to the ongoing drought conditions in the Tri-Valley, the Dublin San Ramon Services District (DSRSD) Board **voted in favor of emergency measures** to reduce water use.

Effective June 1, 2014, DSRSD is implementing Stage 3 Water Shortage Rates, targeting a 35% reduction in water use. The rates will remain in effect until the Drought Emergency is no longer in effect.

Commercial Customers	Baseline (per 100 cubic ft)	Stage 3 35% Reduction (per 100 cubic ft)
Winter (Nov - April)	\$1.03	\$1.55
Summer (May - Oct)	\$1.23	\$2.16
Potable Irrigation Customers	\$1.44	\$4.02


Additionally, a prohibition will be placed on serving water in restaurants unless requested by customers; commercial customers are also asked to post water conservation signs in bathrooms. Conservation signs and table tent cards are available for free at **DSRSD**.

"The drought is serious and it's hitting the Tri-Valley especially hard," says Operations Manager Dan Gallagher who is spearheading DSRSD's drought response. "We need people to **reduce their water use** now, so together we can survive this drought."

DSRSD serves 157,000 people, providing potable and recycled water service to Dublin and the Dougherty Valley area of Sam Ramon, wastewater collection and treatment to Dublin and south San Ramon, and wastewater treatment to Pleasanton (by contract).
